Our Programs

Hope Gospel Mission has been in existence for eleven years. Over that time we have grown from just an idea to having three locations in Eau Claire – the Men’s Shelter downtown, the Bargain Center complex (which includes the Education Center and Ruth House), and Building Hope. We are very grateful for what God has done through the concerted effort of individuals, churches, businesses, and other non-profit organizations. We seek to provide services to the western Wisconsin region that help many of its most marginalized people.

By using the analogy of a target, our programs to assist needy and homeless people are the bull’s eye of the many services provided by Hope Gospel Mission. We have three programs designed for adult men and women:

1. Our **Emergency Program** is for someone needing help for one to seven days. This may be someone who just needs a meal and a place to stay overnight and includes helping someone just passing through our area.
2. Our **Help Program** is for someone needing longer assistance than the Emergency Program, but who does not have the problems involved in chronic homelessness. This person may be temporarily without employment or housing and just needs a paycheck or two to get back on their feet. This assistance is for up to thirty days.
3. Our **Renewed Hope Program** is our longest and most holistic program. It is designed for those who have the issues of chronic homelessness – habitual unemployment, serious addictions, large debts, and broken relationships. This is the program for someone who sees they need help and wants a life change whereby they can break addictive behavior and become self supporting. It includes food, shelter, health care, education, spiritual instruction and counseling, financial training, job training, and employment. The Renewed Hope Program has four phases and each phase is about six months in length.

Phase One: In this phase an individualized plan is made for each resident. It includes an individualized educational assessment followed by practical classes in our Education Center for half a day for six months. The resident is in work therapy training for the other half of the day. Personal financial training is provided through the *Financial Peace University* class in the evening and the resident attends *Right Start/Right Step*, a twelve step biblically based drug and alcohol recovery program.

Phase Two: This is the stabilizing phase. It includes being active in a local church, continuing to build work related and interpersonal skills, and beginning a direct hire job search that leads to a job by the end of this phase.

Phase Three: This phase is the transitional phase where the resident prepares themselves for independent living. The resident will have 50% of their debt paid off, start the Addiction Relapse Class, continue direct hire employment, increase participation in recreational and social activities, complete their hobby project, and have an established savings account and emergency fund.

Phase Four: The resident pays off their remaining debts, has a mentor from their local church, maintains stable employment, has meetings with their pastor, chaplain, financial advisor, and program director, obtains independent living arrangements, and graduates from the program. A relapse prevention plan is developed. Each resident receives a reliable, used vehicle from our Auto Program when they graduate.

Hope Gospel Mission extends thanks to people who have donated used autos so that graduates of the Renewed Hope Program receive a reliable used vehicle at their graduation. People donating used vehicles to the Auto Program receive a tax deductible receipt for the market value of the auto because the auto goes to a needy recipient. Residents do detailing and light repairs on donated autos as part of their work therapy and employment.

Education Center



Hope Gospel Mission's Education Center has a vital role in the development of residents in our Renewed Hope Program. Residents are assessed when they enter the program and attend class for half a day for six to twelve months. The average computer literacy of an entering resident is 24% and many other assessed areas are also below the acceptable level for employment. Thanks to grants from the Eau Claire Community Foundation, the AnnMarie Foundation, and the many gifts from donors designated for the Education Center, we installed much needed, new computers and software in our Education Center in September. The newer technology will greatly enhance the instruction and learning experience of our residents. In 2008 the Education Center provided 3,590 education hours and 2,261 hours of employment training for our men and women.

Meet the Staff: Dan Adams



Dan Adams, seen here with his wife Julie, daughter Abigail and son Jonathan, is the Program Director and Head Chaplain at Hope Gospel Mission. He also serves as one of the three Resident Managers at the Men's Shelter. His past experience includes being a pastor for ten years and serving as interim pastor for six churches. He has also been privileged to be part of the birth of a new church to which he is called affectionately the "founder". He has served at the Joe Hill Rescue Mission in Los Angeles and through his home church he worked as a youth leader and camp counselor.

Dan graduated from Bible college with a Pastoral major and a minor in Business and History.

While in college he worked at the Milwaukee Rescue Mission for three years in various capacities. He currently serves as one of the pastors at Word of Life Bible Church in Eau Claire.

Dan started working as a volunteer at Hope Gospel Mission shortly after it opened in 1998. He enjoys ministering the word of God to the residents and seeing it take effect in their lives. Dan relates "I recall one such example of a man who came to our doors, tired of life and afraid to face the consequences of his sinful actions. This man met with us, then went to jail for 30 days to do his time, but came right back thanking us for making him deal with the consequences of his sins. Right away you could see God was already at work, and then to see him get saved, join a sound gospel preaching church, graduate and continue to live in this new life in Christ has truly been a tremendous blessing. I thank God for using me and allowing me the privilege to be a part of His saving work of grace at Hope Gospel Mission."

Dan's current work at the Mission includes teaching the *Right Start, Right Step* and *Addiction Relapse Class* (ARC) to the residents.
